ABOUT HOCHSCHULE DER MEDIEN

Hochschule der Medien (Stuttgart Media University) covers a broad spectrum of media expertise: from printed media to electronic media, from design to business administration, from audiovisual media to advertising.

Exchange students coming to Hochschule der Medien are able to choose from a variety of English-taught Minor Programs. Each one of those Minors is a one semester long set program. Most Minors run every semester, and normally consist of 30 ECTS credits. Some Minors might require specific academic or technical skills.

Furthermore, exchange students will be provided with housing options in dormitories near or on campus and the university has a Buddy Program. That way, every exchange student has a personal contact person who will assist them with settling in and make them feel at home in Stuttgart in no time.

FURTHER INFORMATION & DATES

Please note that the required language level for our courses in English is B2 (bachelor's level) / C1 (master's). Exchange students will have a German course as a part of their exchange studies. International students who want to pick courses taught in German need a B2 (bachelor's level) / C1 (master's) level in German.

We use the ECTS system for credits. A typical workload consists of 30 ECTS per semester / 60 ECTS per academic year. Our grading system is based on a scale from 1.0 to 5.0.
